Factors for Effective Product Backlog Prioritization



CUSTOMER VALUE FIRST



What solves the biggest user problem?



What feature delights customers most?

EFFORT vs. IMPACT



High impact, low effort = quick wins



Avoid spending too long on low-value tasks



RISK & UNCERTAINTY



Address risky or unknown items early



Reduce surprises later in development

DEPENDENCIES & SEQUENCING



Order work logically (e.g., socks before shoes!)



Avoid blocking other tasks





STACKEHOLDER INPUT



Balance voices from users, business, and team



Avoid prioritizing just the loudest opinions

VISION & STRATEGY



Balance voices from users, business, and team



Avoid prioritizing just the loudest opinions



BONUS TIP



USE PRIORETIZATION TOOLS



MoSCoW: Must have, Should have, Could have, Won't have



RICE: Reach, Impact, Confidence, Effort



Kano Model: Basic needs vs. performance vs. delight features



Dot Voting: Team votes to decide priorities
